## **Description**

At the end of 1970s, when Christo, a famous artist, tried to wrap the Pont-Neuf in Paris in polyamide, the then Mayor of Paris Jacques Chirac first rejected the project. Mainly because he thought Parisians would not appreciate the artwork. Not because he thought the use of so much plastic would elicit environmental concerns.

Decades later, the use and misuse of plastic have become a significant burden for authorities. As such, plastic pollution is being debated at all levels by States, regional and local authorities, businesses, closely followed by a large group of civil society organizations. This topic has also been on the radar of several international organizations, such as the <u>UN Human Settlements Programme</u> (UN-Habitat), the <u>World Trade Organization</u> (WTO) or the <u>UN Environment Programme</u> (UNEP), with a system-wide coordination mechanism being put in place by the United Nations.

The United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA), the world's highest-level decision-making body on the environment, which enjoys universal membership by all UN member States, is taking the lead in establishing the mandate on a global plastics agreement at its next session in Spring 2022.

But what is the status of local and regional governments (LRGs) within UNEA? Could it be enhanced? If so, how? And for what purpose? Do municipalities share knowledge and experience about the prevention and reduction of plastic pollution?

The Geneva Cities Hub, with UN-Habitat, Norway, the Geneva Environment Network and partners, welcomes all stakeholders to an informal event to discuss concrete ways and means to better include LRGs in plastic pollution-related negotiations.
